

MANDATORY training in which you will be mandated for three years.


This training is for All ministers of communion who distribute communion at the masses, and also who bring communion to the homebound. We will offer TWO different times for the TRAINING SESSION.

SUNDAY REFLECTION:

As Christians, we need to place our entire lives into the hands of Jesus. It is true that we should use our initiative, our gifts, and our strength. But we should do this in keeping with our oneness in Jesus.

After all, he was the one who was crucified for our sins, who showed us ultimate leadership. That leadership is born from humility, his power is born from lowliness. Were we to enter into this same frame of mind, and to make it our life's work to be followers of Christ, then we would be living as true and faithful Christians.

This is our life's work. We are his sheep. He sustains us, he leads us to nourishment and peace, and out of harm. Let us, then pray to Christ for the gift of his discipleship, that we may love and be loved, follow and lead, be his sheep and being others into his fold.

Today, the Fourth Sunday of Easter, is commonly known as 'Good Shepherd Sunday' (because the Gospel is taken from Jesus' teaching in chapter 10 of John's Gospel about himself as the Good Shepherd). But it is also known as 'Vocation Sunday' because on this day we pray especially that more may answer the call to serve the Church in a special way (as did Paul and Barnabus), particularly as pastors and religious.
